## Aid and Attendance for War Era Veterans and Surviving Spouses

### **The VA Aid & Attendance Benefit**

Veterans, 65 years and older who served during war time, may be eligible for a tax-free benefit called the Veterans Aid and Attendance benefit awarded by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

This Veterans Aid and Attendance Benefit was designed to provide financial aid for war era veterans and their surviving spouses to help cover the cost of long-term care at home, in a board and care, or in an assisted living community.

The Aid & Attendance Benefit provides benefits for war era veterans and their surviving spouses who require the regular attendance of another person to assist in at least two of the daily activities of living such as eating, bathing, dressing, transferring and continence issues.
